2017 Annual Conference Report

I was honored to serve as a Lay Delegate for St. Paul at the 108th Session of the Northwest Texas Annual Conference in Lubbock. It was my 2nd time to attend, and a great experience for me. As we tended to the business of the church, were inspired by missional moments, and were Spirit fed by amazing music and preaching.

This year the Abilene District hosted the event which is quite a feat since we weren't on our home turf. I was so proud of our leadership – District Superintendent George Price, our own Rev. Felicia Hopkins, Abilene District Lay Leader Susan Mouser, Lay Leader Pat Mouser, and my husband, David, who serves as Alternate Lay Delegate. Each one of them stepped up to the task they were given and led beautifully.



Additionally, it was our joy and honor to witness the commissioning of Dustin Tatro as a Provisional Deacon. As we recognized him and others for their faithfulness, we offered prayers of thanksgiving for answering God's call to ministry.

We covered many things about the business of the church and heard many reports. Some of the highlights were –

- McMurry University informing us their enrollment is up 4%, summer school increased by 11%, the exciting news regarding the Business School scholarships being fully funded by a \$10 million endowment, and the online degrees that are currently in place that are on the horizon. Our own Eric Gillette will be taking advantage of these online business courses.
- Lydia Patterson Institute informed us that they had 83 graduates this past year and all are in college. Our own Martin Mercado is a graduate of Lydia Patterson.
- In 2016, 77% of Shared Ministries had been received which was on par with the past few years but up 10 points from 2010 and 2011.
- In 2016, a five year strategic plan process was authorized by the conference to identify several things such as assess the conference's strengths, weaknesses and greatest needs in an effort to equip pastoral leaders, launch new churches and worship communities, inspire revitalization and innovation, expand Hispanic/Latino ministry, and grow the pipeline. Progress continues to be made toward this plan and it was voted that the Planning Task Force continue for up to 12 months more for the plan's implementation.

We voted on several resolutions in regard to pension and health plans for clergy and retired clergy, rental and housing allowances for retired or disabled clergy, and the past service rate for the calculation of benefits for clergy under the Pre-1982 pension plan. All these resolutions passed.

Again, thank you for your prayers, well wishes, and this awesome privilege to serve.


